



Bladnoch Samsara, crafted by Australian-owned Bladnoch Distillery, one of Scotland's oldest Single Malt Scotch Whisky distilleries, has been awarded Gold Medal by the 2018 San Francisco World Spirits Competition.

This competition is considered the most influential spirits contest in the world and was founded in 2000 as a way to recognize exceptional products in the spirits category.

Described as exceptional products near the pinnacle of achievement in their category, Gold medalists from the San Francisco Spirit Competition set the standard for all others of their kind.



Displaying traditional Lowland characteristics, Bladnoch released Samsara - a non-aged tribute to the rebirth of the 200-year-old distillery which is luscious, full-bodied and fragrant with a rich, lingering core.

After a gap of over eight years - when Bladnoch ceased production – Australian entrepreneur, David Prior purchased the distillery in 2015 with plans to invest and reinvigorate the iconic whisky brand.

“Single Malt Scotch Whisky is special to me because of the shared appreciation it attracts. I want Bladnoch to be a brand that people discover, share and remember. Said owner & CEO David Prior.

This year, the Bladnoch Distillery turns 200 and to celebrate will launch a rare release anniversary edition.
